

Poster Session

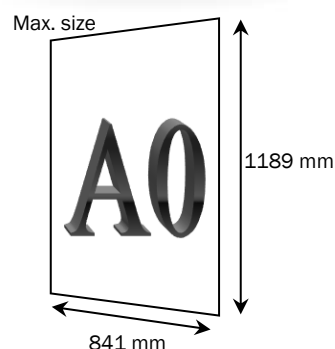
Key information

Due to the large number of speeches submitted and the limited time of the conference, the organisers decide to use sessions of individual discussions with the use of scientific posters. This form of contact allows participants to freely exchange their views.

This form of presentation of scientific research is becoming more and more popular as it helps to establish contacts and allows to present one's scientific work without the need to present a paper.

The course of the poster session:

- The host presents the conference participants with the titles and authors of particular posters.
- The main part of the session begins. Authors go to the positions where posters are prepared.
- Participants of the conference watch the posters, ask questions to the authors, discuss the topic presented on the posters.
- The presenter gives a signal about the end of the poster session.
- Posters in electronic form are placed on the conference website together with the author's data.



Useful Tips

Below are some useful tips that can be useful in creating a poster.

First of all, it's best to:

- sketch a poster concept,
- specify where the title will be placed (usually on the entire width of the sheet),
- place information about the author(s)
- plan all elements (diagrams, photos, maps, text) on the available space,
- determine in which direction the reader will be led through the poster (from top to bottom, from left to right or otherwise).

Title section:

This section should contain the title (readable and visible from 5-6 meters - text height above 72 points) and contact details of the author(s).

Placing a photo(s) of the author(s) will make the first contact better.

Colours

It is best to use subdued colours (shades of grey, beige, or other) as a background.

It is possible to distinguish parts of the poster in different colours, which will create a logical whole.

However, do not exaggerate with the number of colours used.

Text

There shouldn't be too much text on the poster. Write with phrases using sentence equivalents.

A sans-serif font (e.g. Arial) with a height of approx. 36 points is recommended for titles and headers.

The text should be legible (above 18 points).

Graphics

A poster is essentially a graphic presentation. Individual elements should be legible from approx. 3 meters.

Visualizations such as arrows, charts, drawings, diagrams, diagrams, maps are recommended.

Avoid tables with a lot of text.

Important guidelines for the authors

- The date of the poster session:
31st March 2020
(second day of the conference);
- Technical data of the poster:
 - Maximum paper size 120 x 84cm,
 - Format of the electronic version: „pdf”
- It should be acknowledged that **the organizers do not print the posters**
- The electronic version¹ should be sent with the note about who is the author and the affiliation by 13th March 2020 to the address:
konferencja@instytutpe.pl
- You can send the printed poster (with the note: „Conference poster”) or deliver it to the organizers on the first day of the Conference at the reception desk (during registration) at the latest.
- After the Conference, the authors receive the posters from the organizers.

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¹ Sending an electronic version is equivalent to joining the Competition for the Best Poster and acceptance of the Competition Regulations.
